COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

On January 14, 2025, Dirt Dealers XV, Ltd. (Dirt Dealers) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from the Green Valley Special Utility District's (Green Valley SUD) Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10646 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Dirt Dealers asserts that the land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Bexar County, which is a qualifying county. Dirt Dealers filed supplemental information on March 18, 2025.

On April 23, 2025, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 3, directing the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file a recommendation on final disposition by June 3, 2025. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

Staff has reviewed the petition and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis of the Infrastructure Division, recommends that the petition be approved. Specifically, Staff recommends that the revised petition submitted by Dirt Dealers be found to satisfy the requirements of TWC § 13.2541(b) and 16 TAC § 24.245(h). The final water CCN map and certificate are attached. Staff recommends that the final map and certificate be provided to Green Valley SUD and that Dirt Dealers file a certified copy of the CCN map and a boundary description of the CCN service area in the Bexar County Clerk's office, as required under TWC § 13.257(r)-(s).

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends the revised petition be approved and respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with the foregoing recommendations.

On January 14, 2025, Dirt Dealers XV, LTD. (Dirt Dealers or Petitioner) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Green Valley Special Utility District's (Green Valley SUD) water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10646 in Bexar County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Dirt Dealers asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Bexar County, which is a qualifying county.

Dirt Dealers provided a warranty deed confirming ownership of the tract of land within Green Valley SUD's certificated service area. In addition, Dirt Dealers submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the tract of land was not receiving water service from the CCN holder. Green Valley SUD did not request to intervene.

Based on the mapping review by Hank Journeay, Infrastructure Division, the revised maps and digital mapping data filed with Item 7 on March 18, 2025 are sufficient.


Dirt Dealers XV, Ltd. owns approximately 51.39 acres as conveyed in Deed Doc. No. 20070172673 – Tract 4. The tract of land in the petition for streamlined expedited release is approximately 26.2 acres, of which approximately 16.8 acres overlap Green Valley SUD (CCN No. 10646) and would be decertified from CCN No. 10646.

In accordance with TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), Dirt Dealers has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the release of the tract of land from Green Valley SUD's CCN No. 10646. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Additionally, I recommend that a final map and certificate be provided to the CCN holder.
