<u>TEXAS INDUSTRIAL ENERGY CONSUMERS FIRST REQUEST</u> <u>FOR INFORMATION TO THE STAFF OF THE</u> <u>PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS</u>

Pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144, Texas Industrial Energy Consumers ("TIEC") requests that the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Staff") provide all of the information requested in Exhibit "A" within the time frame specified under the procedural schedule set in this proceeding.

Pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144(c)(2), TIEC further requests that answers to the requests for information be made under oath. Each answer should identify the person responsible for preparing that answer (other than the purely clerical aspects of its preparation) and the name of the witness in this proceeding who will sponsor the answer and who can vouch for its accuracy. In producing documents pursuant to this request for information, please indicate the specific request(s) to which the document is being produced. These requests are continuing in nature, and should there be, for any reason, a change in circumstances which would modify or change an answer supplied by you, such changed answer should be submitted immediately as a supplement to your original answer pursuant to 16 T.A.C. § 22.144(i). Please answer each request and subrequest in the order in which they are listed and in sufficient detail to provide a complete and accurate answer to the request. TIEC further requests that each item of information be made available as it is completed, rather than upon compilation of all information requested.

DEFINITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

A. "Commission Staff," "Staff", or "you" refers to Commission Staff, and its affiliates, subsidiaries, and any person acting or purporting to act on their behalf, including without limitation, attorneys, agents, advisors, investigators, representatives, employees or other persons.

B. "CenterPoint Energy Houston Electric, LLC", "CenterPoint", or "the Company" refers to CenterPoint Energy Houston Electric, LLC, and its affiliates, subsidiaries, and any person acting or purporting to act on their behalf, including without limitation, attorneys, agents, advisors, investigators, representatives, employees or other persons.

C. The terms "document" or "documents" are used in their broadest sense to include, by way of illustration and not limitation, all written or graphic matter of every kind and description whether printed, produced, reproduced or stored by any process whether visually, magnetically, mechanically, electronically or by hand, whether final or draft, original or reproduction, whether or not claimed to be privileged or otherwise excludable from discovery, and whether or not in your actual or constructive possession, custody, or control. The terms include writings, correspondence, telegrams, memoranda, studies, reports, surveys, statistical compilations, notes, calendars, tapes, computer disks, data on computer drives, e-mail, cards, recordings, contracts, agreements, invoices, licenses, diaries, journals, accounts, pamphlets, books, ledgers, publications, microfilm, microfiche and any other data compilations from which information can be obtained and translated, by you if necessary, into reasonably usable form. The definition includes electronic information that has been deleted. "Document" or "documents" shall also include every copy of a document where the copy contains any commentary or notation of any kind that does not appear on the original or any other copy.

D. I. The term "including," or one of its inflections, means and refers to "including but not limited to."

J. Words used in the plural shall also be taken to mean and include the singular. Words used in the singular shall also be taken to mean and include the plural.

K. The present tense shall be construed to include the past tense, and the past tense shall be construed to include the present tense.

L. If any document is withheld under any claims of privilege, please furnish a list identifying each document for which a privileges is claimed together with the following information: date, sender, recipients of copies, subject matter of the document, and the basis upon which such privilege is claimed. This instruction is not intended to impose an obligation greater than contemplated by the Commission's rules and any applicable orders in this case.

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The following RFIs pertain to the Direct Testimony of Michael Noth.

- **TIEC 1-1** Referring to page 16, lines 11-15, describe the analysis Mr. Noth performed to validate the accuracy of the BCA's which Guidehouse purports would provide a net cost benefit to customers.
- **TIEC 1-2** Referring to page 19, lines 3-4, was Mr. Noth aware when filing testimony that of the 1,473 structures proposed for replacement, only 653 are wood? If no, does this information change his recommendation for this measure?
- **TIEC 1-3** Referring to page 23, and RM-6 of the table, state where in CenterPoint's SRP it discussed any alternative to replacing the existing steel and concrete structures under this measure.
- **TIEC 1-4** Referring to page 23, and RM-7 of the table:
 - a. Does Mr. Noth see any distinction between projects that will increase capacity and projects that will increase resilience? Please explain your response.
 - b. Are projects that increase capacity eligible for special cost recovery under the Commission's SRP rule? Please explain your response.
 - c. Would converting the existing 69 kV network to 138 kV increase capacity? Please explain your response.
- **TIEC 1-5** Referring to page 24, lines 13-14:
 - a. Describe "Guidehouse's prioritization process" and how it was applied to the measures which Mr. Noth reviewed.
 - b. Is Mr. Noth aware that Guidehouse's BCA ratios are based on a 1-hour VOLL of \$35,000 per megawatt hour; however, Guidehouse utilized much longer durations in calculating the BCA ratios?

c. Referring to Exhibit ELS-2, page 99, was Mr. Noth aware when filing his testimony that Guidehouse's BCA ratio for the Transmission System Hardening Measure is based on "1,473 wooden poles," which indicates that its BCA ratio may not have accounted for the actual mix of 1,473 structures to be replaced within this measure? If no, does this information change his recommendation for this measure?
