COMMISSION STAFF'S RESPONSE TO ORDER NO. 3

On March 19, 2025, Dolgencorp of Texas, Inc (Dolgencorp of Texas or the Company) filed an application for registration as a renewable energy credit (REC) microgenerator aggregator pursuant to 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 25.173(k). On March 28, 2025, Commission Staff filed a recommendation. On April 1, 2025, the administrative law judge (ALJ) issued Order No. 1, requiring clarification and setting deadlines. On April 2, 2025, Dolgencorp of Texas filed a response to Order No. 1. On April 10, 2025, the ALJ issued Order No. 2, requiring clarification. On April 11, 2025, Dolgencorp of Texas, clarified that it will have 28 total microgeneration sites and the combined capacity of all the sites is 1596 kWac. On April 16, 2025, the ALJ issued Order No. 3 requiring Staff to fille a supplemental recommendation. On April 22, 2025, Dolgencorp of Texas filed updated microgenerator listing information.

Dolgencorp of Texas will calculate the megawatt-hours (MWh) of energy production for its aggregation unit by an electronic meter that meets ANSI C12 standards. The Company stated that its aggregation unit represents 28 microgenerators.

After reviewing Dolgencorp of Texas' microgenerator aggregator registration application and supplemental filings, I have concluded that Dolgencorp of Texas has satisfactorily completed the registration requirements under 16 TAC § 25.173(k) by providing all requested information. Staff recommends Dolgencorp of Texas be approved as a REC aggregator pursuant to 16 TAC § 25.173(k).

After reviewing the information provided about the REC microgenerator facilities, Staff concludes that Dolgencorp of Texas has provided all of the information required under 16 TAC § 25.173(d) and that this aggregation unit of Dolgencorp of Texas qualifies as a solar renewable resource under 16 TAC § 25.173(e)(2)(A). The total generating capacity of Dolgencorp of Texas' aggregation unit that is eligible to produce RECS is approximately 1.596 megawatts (MWs). Any additional REC microgenerators added to this aggregation unit will not be eligible to produce RECs until an order is issued approving the additional MWs of energy to be produced by the aggregation unit.
