# **Notice of Proposed Rate Change**

has filed a rate change application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission or PUCT). The application may be reviewed online at interchange puc.texas.gov. You may also inspect a copy of the rate change application at your utility's office at the address below or at the Commission's office (1701 N. Congress Ave, Austin, TX 78701). The proposed rates will apply to service received after the effective date provided below, unless modified or suspended by the Commission. If the Commission receives a sufficient number of protests, separately or in a combined protest letter, from at least 7,897 ratepayers (10 percent of the utility's customers over whose rates the Commission has original jurisdiction) or from any affected municipality before the 91st day after the proposed effective date, the matter will be set for hearing. ## Ratepayer comments attachment

The proposed rate increase is shockingly drastic, from \$3.70 per 1,000 gallons (no tiering) to:

Cost per 1,000 gallons	<u>Usage range</u>
\$5.498	1-5,000 gallons
\$8.247	5,001-10,000 gallons
\$13.745	10,001-20,000 gallons
\$15.12	20,001 gallons and over

This increase would nearly *quadruple* my total water charges during the 6 months or so per year when my usage typically gets to 50,000-60,000 gallons. This neighborhood consists of large homes on large lots, large families, and nearly every house has a pool. We are expected to maintain a high standard in our yards and landscaping, and that requires water. It would be bad enough if the proposal was to increase the existing rate of \$3.70 with no tier to the proposed Tier 1 rate of \$5.498, a nearly 50% jump, but the additional tiers are especially draconic, in particular since they seem focused where most of my and my neighbors' usage is concentrated.

Another aspect of the proposal that makes it difficult to reconcile is that we generally do not get good service from Aqua Texas. We have frequently had problems with complete loss of pressure, repeated water boil notices, and even when the lines are up, we tend to suffer from suboptimal pressure, e.g. 30-35 psi instead of the more typical 50-70 psi.
